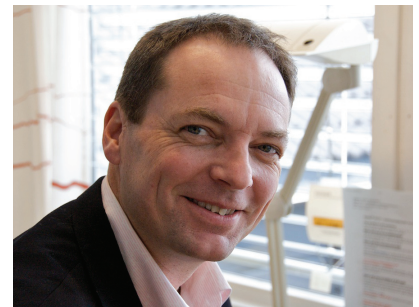
Toralf Johannessen has been appointed new CEO of CORENA Holding A/S
